

RICHARD GRANOFF A.S. GRANOFF ARCHITECTS A FULL HOUSE of four kids and two dogs, this Greenwich family home required a spacious and efficient kitchen. Richard

Granoff of R.S. Granoff Architects headed the team that created a 500-square-foot space that allows the family to spend time together and entertain friends. Maintaining a traditional style that blends with the home, Granoff, along with Fairfield-based decorator Ray Forehand, opted for a palette of neutral colors, natural woods and clean lines. "The design created simplicity through modern elements that blended well with the traditional style of the rest of the home," Granoff explains. "It was important to the clients that the space allow for good natural lighting and provide views to the backyard pool and outdoor entertaining spaces." Details of the bright and airy space, including teak and glossy cabinetry by Allmilmö fulfill this perfectly. Horizontal paneling designed by Forehand elongates the space, too.
